On Thursday 29 April 2010 at approximately 0137hrs I, Officer Koch, was contacted via phone at the Carlisle Police Department by Warren Co Communications (WCC) asking me to respond to [redacted] where Carlisle Fire/ Rescue was on a medical call, because there was a report that the driver of Carlisle Rescue was possibly intoxicated. I advised WCC to contact Senior Officer Brady Jackson and advise him of the situation and I would be en route.

Prior to going to [redacted] I drove past the Carlisle Fire Department to see if Carlisle Rescue 235 had returned to the station. I did not see that the rescue unit had arrived back. As I drove around the block en route to the above address I heard Carlisle 235 advise over the radio they had arrived back at the station. I circled the block and pulled up in front of the station. WCC advised me they were unable to reach Officer Jackson on his cell phone and then advised me that he was calling back as we were speaking.

As I walked up towards the ambulance bay I observed that the driver, Mr. Tyler Beckler had exited the ambulance and started walking towards the office area and then went into the rear medical portion of the ambulance. As I walked back to speak with Mr. Beckler I overheard Fire Chief Scott Burger, who was seated in the front passenger seat of 235, having a conversation with someone advising them that he was "plssed" because he was asked to leave the residence where they were called. Mr. Burger's speech appeared to be slurred. I briefly made contact with Mr. Beckler who I did not smell any odor of alcoholic beverages and did not appear to have any indicators of being intoxicated. I waited for Mr. Burger to finish his conversation and noticed that he continued to have slurred speech throughout the conversation. After Mr. Burger was finished with his conversation he advised me that he was asked to leave the residence by the home owner. I then asked Mr. Burger to step away from the other rescue personnel and speak with me. I questioned Mr. Burger about who had been driving the ambulance and he advised me that he had not driven. I advised Mr. Burger that someone had called and made a complaint stating that they could smell alcohol on one of the rescue personnel. I then questioned Mr. Burger regarding alcohol consumption tonight and he first told me that he had consumed one beer and then stated he had consumed two beers. I advised Mr. Burger that I could detect and odor of alcoholic beverage emitting from his breath.

As I was speaking with Mr. Burger Officer Jackson showed up at the fire department from his residence. Officer Jackson spoke with Mr. Burger regarding the situation and then Mr. Burger consented to providing a preliminary breath test (PBT) Mr. Burger provided a sample of breath which indicated his BAC at .152 (legal limit .08). After the administration of the breath test Officer Jackson spoke with Mr. Burger, while I spoke with Mr. Beckler. I asked Mr. Beckler if he had smell alcohol on Mr. Burger and he advised me that he did a little bit, but not really until they had arrived at the residence.

After Officer Jackson was finished speaking with Mr. Burger he and I went to [redacted] and spoke with the complainant [redacted]. [redacted] advised us that the individual, who he gave a description of a male with facial hair and glasses, had slurred speech, was leaning on the wall of his hallway and "screwed up" while taking his wife's [redacted]. Officer Jackson asked [redacted] how the individual had "screwed up" the [redacted] and he advised that the individual could not match the [redacted] with the [redacted]. [redacted] also informed us that he had to intervene with what the individual was doing because he was attempting to give his wife [redacted] and shouldn't have been because he wasn't answering him and could have choked. [redacted] stated he had to ask the assisting Frasier unit to take over the care of his wife and to check Mr. Burger out and see if he was impaired.

Officer Jackson and I then spoke with Frasier members Clint Mewdon and Jeremy Ringgenberg.

Title: *Jackson supplemental*

On Thu 29 April 2010 at approx. 0204 hrs Warren County Communications contacted me, via telephone, and advised PO Koch requested my assistance at the Carlisle Fire Department because he had received a report Fire Dept. Chief Burger responded to a call intoxicated. When I arrived at the fire department I spoke with Chief Burger and PO Koch. PO Koch's dashboard camera and body microphone were initiated. Chief Burger stated he had consumed 2 beers with dinner and acknowledged consuming alcohol and responding to calls is against his department's policy. Chief Burger consented to a Preliminary Breath Test (PBT) and provided a sufficient sample which indicated a Breath Alcohol Content (BAC) of .152.

PO Koch and I then spoke with [REDACTED] at his home. [REDACTED] stated Mr. Burger was walking and leaning against the hallway wall while approaching his incoherent wife and he detected an odor of alcohol or mouth wash. [REDACTED] stated Chief Burger attempted to test his wife's blood sugar but was unable to touch the test strip to the [REDACTED]. Chief Burger was also attempting to give [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] wife even though she was not coherent.

PO Koch and I then spoke with 3 individuals working for Frasier Medical Services. Two of the men had direct contact with Chief Burger and they stated he was actually hindering their ability to help the situation, adding Chief Burger was very close to [REDACTED] and exclaiming how much he loved assisting the family and helping her out. Both men stated he was acting very unprofessional.

I contacted Warren County Communications and requested a copy of a phone call they had received from Chief Burger where he was upset about being asked to leave the [REDACTED] home.
